# CAMP FUSION

is a five day, four night camping experience for 6-12th graders who are members of Texas Baptist Intercultural Churches. Camp Fusion is aimed at connecting second generation students and spiritually growing them at this crucial time in their faith journey. During camp they will worship, fellowship, and grow intellectually through teaching, physically through recreation, and spiritually through God's word.



## WHERE IS CAMP FUSION?

Camp Fusion 2023 will be July 25-29 at Latham Springs Baptist Camp near West, TX. The camp site is an approximately a 1.5 hour drive from Dallas and a 3 hour drive from Houston. Camp check-in begins at 3pm on Tuesday, July 25th. We will not be able to let campers into the dorms until 3pm.

## HOW MUCH DOES CAMP COST?

The cost for each student is \$190 for the entire week. This fee covers a bunk in a same-gender dorm, meals for each day at camp, a t-shirt, and all camp programs. For every 10 students, an adult sponsor is required to accompany those students of the same gender. The fee for each adult sponsor is also \$190.

If you are over 18 and are interested in being a volunteer camp counselor or a member of the recreation team, please contact us for further details.

## IS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE?

Yes, we provide need-based scholarships for students who cannot pay the full fee or part of the fee. Each student must apply for scholarship consideration by Wednesday, June 1st to be considered for financial assistance. Please contact us or visit our website to download the form.

## HOW DO I REGISTER FOR CAMP?

Students can register for camp through their church youth leader or Pastor. Students may not register individually. Youth leaders and Pastors can contact us using the information on the back of this brochure to register.

## WHAT PROGRAMS ARE OFFERED?

Aside from worship and messages from the speaker, we have a number of programs and activities to foster fellowship and spiritual growth. An example of the camp schedule is also provided for your reference.

### Small groups

Students are assigned a small group on the first evening of camp based on their age group (middle school/high school). Small groups are co-ed and are led by Counselors and volunteer teams. Students will develop relationships with one another through their small group discussion time and as a team during recreation.

### Morning Recreation and Evening Fellowship

Each morning students will have time to bond as a team through recreational group games and competition. In the evening there are camp-wide activities to cultivate fellowship and unity.



### Workshops

Student will attend up to 3 workshops during the week. Guest speakers, Pastors, and subject matter experts share topics facing youth today through a Biblical lens.

### Church Group Time

Each evening, churches will have time to come and grow together as they discuss the speaker's message and their experiences throughout the day. Even though students are encouraged to make new friends, we realize that each student's home church community is important in maintaining their spiritual life after camp.

### Free Time

Students will have free time each day to do what they choose. The camp site offers numerous activities from them to choose from or they can hang out and rest. Some offerings are the lake front, ropes course, paintball, and basketball.
