Early Bird Session

Andrew Pressley

Engaging Kids in Corporate Worship (with KidsCore Preview)

This session will feature a presentation of convictions and practical ideas for engaging children in gathered worship. KidsCore, a customizable song-by-song music and worship curriculum, will be available to preview as well.

Breakout Sessions

Darlene Abbott

A NEW Song!

Teaching music with color. Breaking down the basics of music with simple techniques using one of the first things young children learn – colors. Boost your teaching with the knowledge that these musical concepts, as well as classroom management techniques, can be taught so simply. [Preschool – 2nd Grade]

A NEW Groove

Movement. How do we teach with movement for younger children? This session will look at ways to teach musical and spiritual concepts using movement. Children move all the time. Learn how we can harness that energy and make it productive towards spiritual and musical development. [Preschool – 2nd Grade]

Music Fun with Basketballs

Teaching music and steady beat with basketballs. Be ready to move in this class. We will all use basketballs to practice the concepts being taught. We will also learn part of a routine using basketballs. (We will learn as much of a routine as time will allow.) [Grades 3-6]

Scripture Memory for Young Children

We are to hide God's word in our hearts. But can preschoolers really memorize Scripture? What about 1st graders? How much Scripture? Should we do one Scripture a week? We will explore the answers to all these questions and more. We will learn different Scripture memory techniques using music and rhythm. [Preschool – 2nd Grade]

Smarties! Strategies to Reach and Motivate All of God's Children

God gifts us with so many ways to be smart. Multiple intelligence theory can help us find new ways to motivate every child in our choir. Boost your teaching game and learn a few new things about yourself and your family as well. [Grades 1-6]

Terrific Tune Ups

How do we get their attention – and keep it? Let's test drive some unique exercises and games to keep our choirs focused and working together. You can use these strategies in your classes this week. [All ages]

Scripture Skits

Every child has a special part in these Scripture skits. Let's look at some skit/song pairings for worship, VBS, Summer Camp, and choir tours. We'll dive deep into our Bibles with creativity and fun and give our kids a memorable experience with Scripture. [All ages]

Instruments, Kids & Choir – Oh My! Learn how to incorporate instruments in your choir rehearsal in a fun and engaging way. Instruments are a good way to engage kids who "don't like to sing" and those who do. We'll play boomwackers, chimes, shakers, and maybe some instruments you haven't thought about using in your choir rehearsal. [All ages]

A New Day – A New Rehearsal

This class will demonstrate how to structure a children's choir rehearsal: arriver activity, spiritual lesson, teaching a song (including

basic conducting and music teaching strategies), and reviewing a song. [Grades 1-6] **A New Way to Do Children's Choir – Worship Arts**

Interested in transitioning your children's choir into more of a worship arts ministry? Curious about what a worship arts ministry for kids looks like? This class will walk you through setting up a worship arts ministry and/or give you lots of ideas of arts classes that can be incorporated into your children's choir program. [Grades 1-6]

A Whole New Ballgame: Putting on a Musical For those who have never done a musical before and for those who have but could use some new direction and new ideas. In this class we'll walk through the entire process of putting on a musical. Starting with choosing the right musical all the way to the after party – and everything in between. [Grades 1-6]

Angela Leonhardt is the music specialist at Hidden Forest Elementary in San Antonio where she was the 2018 NEISD Elementary Teacher of the Year. She received her Orff certification from Trinity University. Angela teaches Orff Level I Pedagogy courses in the summer and is an active clinician in the U.S. and Canada. She has served on the Board of Directors of the Central Texas Orff Chapter in the posts of Recording Secretary, Treasurer, VP and President and chair of the Curriculum **Oversight and Review Committee for AOSA.** Her service to NAfME-Texas a division of NAfME includes President, the council of chairs for K-12 Music and Music in Our Schools Month. Publications have been included in The Southwestern Musician, TMEC Connections, AOSA Reverberations and General Music Today. She is a contributing author with Growing in Grace and directs children's choirs at her church and school. She serves as an adjunct professor on the music education faculty at the University of Texas at San Antonio and Trinity University, teaching courses in music technology, diverse learners in the music classroom and music and related arts.

Three-time Dove-Award winning children's writer, Christy Semsen has been writing children's musicals for 12 years. With over 24 published musicals, five Choral Collections and 10 Dove Award nominations, she has had over 150 songs published and performed by children across the world. She and her husband Daniel recently started a choral music publishing company, Semsen Music, and are thrilled to be able to creatively continue serving the church in new ways. Traveling around the country, she teaches on drama, choreography and engaging both younger and older children through utilizing the most current musical styles, while teaching them a love of Scripture and worship. She currently directs a choir of kids K-8th grade in the Burbank Community Kids Choir and loves serving kids. Christy has a M.A. in Pastoral Studies (Emphasis, Worship Leadership) from Azusa Pacific University's Haggard School of Theology (2010), as well as a B.A. in Music Theory/Composition; Music Education from Azusa Pacific University (1998). She resides in Burbank, California, with her husband, composer/arranger/orchestrator Daniel Semsen and has two sons in college, Nathaniel (21) and Noah (19).
