YOUTH MINISTRY CERTIFICATION

2024-2025 Cohort #2

This program is designed for ministerial staff and lay leaders of the Youth Ministry of a church who have a passion for ministry but have no formal education on the basics of ministry. These certification courses equip the ministry leader to meet the needs of teenagers, teachers and parents through events, training events and outreach opportunities.

Details and Requirements

- Our 2024-25 cohort will be limited to 12 students.
- Cost is \$500 for the year or 2 payments of \$250 (August & January).
- Monthly meetings from August May.
- Texts and readings will be required throughout the course along with brief, written summaries of each session.

Assignments

Each time we meet you will have 2 different types of assignments:

- Book Review You'll write at least a 3-5 sentence overview of each chapter of the book we read. For example, September 12 would include an overview of Chapter 2 in Your First Two Years of Ministry as well as the Intro & Chapter 1 in Emotionally Healthy Leader
- 2. Session Review Using the notes you will take from the previous session; you will

submit a 2-3 page report of the most helpful insights from the previous Zoom meeting. This could be an overview of the discussion we had OR if could be an action step that you would like to integrate after the session.

For example, on September 12 you will turn in a session review of our opening Zoom gathering on August 15. This is why it's so vital to keep notes throughout the day.

These papers will need to be emailed to me and Nicole.

While you won't receive a grade, I will read each paper and will give it back to you to complete if you haven't completed it in full.

Please don't get behind with your work. You will have at grace period of one month to get the assignments turned in. For example, if you are unable to turn in everything that is due on September 12, you will have until the following session (October 7-8, Conclave) to turn it in. If you are reading and keeping up, this shouldn't be a problem.
