YOUTH MINISTRY CERTIFICATION

2025-2026 Cohort #3

This program is designed for ministerial staff and lay leaders of the Youth Ministry of a church who have a passion for ministry but have no formal education on the basics of ministry. These certification courses equip the ministry leader to meet the needs of teenagers, teachers and parents through events, training events and outreach opportunities.

- Our 2025-26 cohort will be limited to 15 students.
- Cost is \$500 for the year or 2 payments of \$250 (August & January).
- Monthly meetings from August May. YOU MUST BE ONLINE & ON CAMERA FOR ALL OF THE MEETINGS. You may miss up to two meetings MAX but it will need to be made up by watching a replay of the Zoom meeting.
- Texts, reading and written reports will be required throughout the course along with written summaries of each session.
- Sessions will be led by Kurt Krodle (Youth Ministry Specialist) & Cory Liebrum (Director, Discipleship & NextGen) with special guests every month

Assignments

Each time we meet you will have 3 different assignments:

- 1. Book Review You'll write 2-3 page overview of each book we read.
- 2. Ongoing Book Review We will be reading two books (Emotionally Healthy Leader & Lead Them to Jesus) throughout the year. You will write 2-3 sentences for each chapter of the book that is due that month.
- 3. Session Review Using the notes you will take from the previous session, you will submit a 1-2 page report of the most helpful insights from the previous Zoom. This could be an overview of the discussion we had OR it could be an action step you would like to integrate after the previous lesson.
 - For example, on September 12 you will turn in a session review of our opening Zoom gathering on August 15. This is why it's so vital to keep notes throughout the day.

• SESSION 1

Philosophy of Youth Ministry - August 14, 2025

Family Ministry isn't just an 'add-on' to youth ministry. The work of reaching & serving parents should be woven through everything happening in a church's youth ministry. This session will address the different models of family ministry so you can implement the best method in your church context.

SESSION 6

Event Planning 101 – January 29, 2026

Camp, D-Now, Retreats, and Mission Trips are just a few of the events that happen during a calendar year for a youth ministry. There are some tools that can help any church leader navigate these events to help you work smarter and not harder. How you protect students, youth leaders and your church is also an important part that we will consider.

• SESSION 7

Communication and Navigating Relationships in Youth Ministry – February 19, 2026

Leading youth ministry in the local church can feel isolating but it doesn't have to be. Youth leaders have more influence than they realize when it comes to building relationships with other individuals and ministries in the church. The youth ministry should exist to serve the church and not as a parachurch organization looking from the outside in.

The Youth Leader's Health and Family - April 9, 2026

Youth ministry is a calling. For some that is for a lifetime and for others it's a season. However long you serve in youth ministry, you need to make sure you are taking care of yourself and your family.

SESSION 9

Student Leadership & Calling out the Called - May 7, 2026

Youth ministry has the unique opportunity to enlist teenagers to help serve in their own ministry. There are some effective ways to help empower these students as they begin their leadership journey. Some of these students will be our future church leaders, ministers and pastors. We will discuss how to encourage those sensing God's call to ministry and how to pursue that calling.
