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# **Pad Instructions**

#### **Pad Supplies:**

- Flannel for one side of the pad
- PUL for the other side of the pad
- Batting inside the pads
- Scissors
- Thread
- Sewing machine
- Serger if you have one

#### **Instructions:**

Cut the flannel and PUL into 4" x 8" rectangles. Flannel will be the top and PUL bottom of the pad.



Cut batting into 4" x 8" rectangles. You will put two pieces of batting between the flannel and PUL pieces. Using the sewing machine,



sew two straight lines about I" from the edge of the flannel. This will secure the batting and make it easier to use the serger for the edges.



The serger stitches closed

the edges and finishes the edges nicely plus cutting off excess material.

You can do square or rounded corners because either will work. If you don't have a serger, use a zig zag stitch on the sewing machine for the edges of the pads.

Shorter pads can also be used for teen girls or women of small stature.

## Circular Pad Holder Instructions

#### **Pad Holder Supplies:**


- Flannel
- PUL material or another material that can form a moisture barrier
- Thread
- Kam Snaps or Velcro
- Sewing machine

#### **Instructions:**

These instructions are for a layered, 8-inch diameter pad holder with a PUL/moisture barrier liner.

On heavy cardstock, draw an 8 inch circle and cut it out. Make the circle with two lines at the top. You will stop stitching between these lines allowing for the pad to be turned inside out.

Ribbon is used to hold the pad in place on the holder. Punch six small holes in the pattern for the ribbon and kam snap or Velcro placements. Once the holder is turned inside out, you will be able to mark where the ribbon and kam snaps or Velcro are to be attached.



#### What is PUL?

It is a laminated fabric whose full name is polyurethane laminate. It is waterproof which is perfect to create a moisture barrier for reusable menstrual pads and pad holders.

It can be quite expensive so shop around or use coupons.

Search out stores online who sell it in bulk and at a discount.

# Another Option

Thin plastic is another option that can be used in place of PUL.

### Circular Pad Holder Instructions

#### For the circular pad holder, you will cut:

- Two pieces of flat cotton flannel in 10 inch by 10 inch squares
- One piece of PUL or other moisture barrier material in a 10 inch by 10 inch square
- Two pieces of one inch ribbon in four inch lengths

#### How to put the holder together:

- Take two flannel pieces and place the right sides together.
- Place one piece of PUL material/moisture barrier material on top.
- Trace the circle shape on to one of the wrong sides of the flannel pieces.
   Mark the lines where the stitching will stop.
- Stitch 1/2 inch from the edge around the circle, leaving the opening so you can turn the pad inside out.
- Trim the extra flannel down to 1/4 inch **EXCEPT** where you left the opening. Turn the holder inside out and smooth out any wrinkles.
- Tuck the fabric where you left the opening and pin to hold it in place. Iron it down, if needed. At the very least, use a few sprays of water to smooth out the fabric. If will make the pad look nice.
- Top stitch 1/8 inch away from the edge all the way around the holder.

### Circular Pad Holder Instructions

- Place the pattern over the pad and mark where the ribbon and kam snaps or Velcro are to be placed.
- Stitch the ends of the ribbon at the top and bottom of the pad. A pad will slip under the ribbons and hold the pad in place.
- Place the kam snaps or Velcro on each side of the pad holder. The sides wrap around the crotch of an undergarment and the kam snaps/Velcro keep the holder in place.
- Top stitch 1/8 inch away from the edge all the way around the holder.





Kam snaps and kam snap pliers can be purchased at fabric stores or online. The snaps are less expensive if you purchase them in bulk. Snaps come in three pieces: a button, a male piece, and a female piece. Pay attention when putting them on so they snap correctly.
